### Electronic Scoring Assistance

The MyCricket helpdesk has received a significant number of queries relating to scorers not being able to access the Electronic Scoring app due to matches that have been locked by other users. The majority of these are related to previous scorers not closing off the match properly at the completion of the day's play or at the end of each innings if the scorers are then swapping.

### Captains & Umpires Reports

A reminder to all Umpires and Captains to complete Survey Monkey Umpires and Captains reports this season. These are due no later than 10pm on the Monday following a fixture. Links to these are available on the CNW website homepage. These reports are to be completed by Captains and Umpires for all 1<sup>st</sup> Grade and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade matches.

### First Grade Scorers

All First-grade scorers should ensure they use the 'MyCricket download and upload' feature in Total Cricket Scorer. This will enable scorers to be synced directly to the MyCricket website and Live Scores will be available via MyCricket, rather than Total Cricket Scorer. Scorers will require a MyCricket log-in and internet connection (or personal hotspot) to download match for this feature to work.

## Hursey Seafood MVP Award

Hursey Seafoods in conjunction with CNW will again sponsor the 1<sup>st</sup> Grade and Female competition Most Valuable Player awards for the 2019/20 season.

The award recognises player performances in 1<sup>st</sup> Grade One-day and Two-day games and Female T20 matches. The best performing player each week from each competition will receive a \$60 dine-in meal voucher from Hursey Seafoods (max. 2 per player), with the overall winner receiving \$500 cash.

The points system, which is outlined below, has slightly changed from previous seasons to ensure batsmen and bowlers have an equal chance at winning this award.

- 1 point per run
- 20 points unassisted wicket
- 10 points assisted wicket
- 10 points per catch
- 10 points unassisted run out
- 5 points assisted run out
- 10 points per stumping
- 1 point per not out
- 5 points for 50 runs in an innings
- 15 points for 100 runs in innings
- 10 points for 5 wickets in an innings

Action	Insight/Benefit
Flyers direct participants to contact Coordinator directly not straight to PlayCricket	Parents have opportunity to ask questions directly and coordinator can provide level of comfort about the program "people buy people" A good coordinator is key.
Participants encouraged to register in a group of 6 with a manager	Girls more likely to sign up to a new sport in a group. With the manager already assigned makes everything easier for the coordinator and the girls are connected from the start
Reduced registration fee & considered time and day of program	We don't want to under sell our programs. However girls are already busy and enrolled in other sports so squeezing in another sport requires a compromise. If parents are already playing \$100+ for each 1 <sup>st</sup> and 2 <sup>nd</sup> choice sport, reducing the fee and thinking about time and day of the program can have a positive impact on registrations.
Engaged local high school	The local high school students are acting as umpires for the program
Think ahead - how does the program operate	Consider splitting the ages. Younger girls prefer to play against girls of a similar age and older girls prefer to play against girls of a similar skill level.
